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MEU" and Association of Arab Universities to Organize the Fourth International" Conference on Strategic Awareness and Governance this Month

Amman - The Middle East University is organizing the Fourth International Conference on Strategic Awareness and Governance in cooperation with the Association of Arab Universities. The conference is titled: "Digital Governance", and is taking place on Saturday, the twentieth of this month.

The conference is sponsored by Chairman of the Arab Universities Governance Council Dr. Yacoub Nasereddin, in the presence of the Secretary-General of the association Prof. Amr Ezzat Salama. The conference will include a wide participation of experts, academics, and specialists representing 8 Arab countries other than Jordan.

The conference is a product of the Arab Universities Governance Council, in cooperation with the Faculties of Business, and Arts and Educational Sciences at the university.

This conference comes in implementation of the recommendations of the Third International Conference on Strategic Awareness and Governance, which was held at the Middle East University. These recommendations discuss the importance of adapting to the requirements of our generation, as well as the encouragement and

promotion of scientific research.

The conference aims to encourage the transition to digital practices in governance, by taking advantage of global networks and information and communication technology sciences. In addition to establishing the rules for the digital transformation of governance and the methodologies used to apply them in Arab universities. The conference also advocates for expanding the scope of scientific research in digital governance to build intellectual systems that would be beneficial in terms of leadership, creativity, digital innovation, solving administrative and technical problems, and laying the foundations for the governance of Arab universities and its indicators.

As for the conference's 6 themes, they are: governance digital transformation strategies, the legislative and regulatory framework for digital governance, leadership, creativity and innovation in digital governance, the fundamentals of governance of Arab universities and their indicators, the governance of digital business fields, and the principles of university governance: Arab and international experiences.

MEU” Impressionist Art Exhibition Represents Values, Heritage, and Tourism”



Amman – The Faculty of Architecture and Design at the Middle East University held an art exhibition that included a number of conceptual impressionist paintings. The exhibition presented an opportunity to see paintings that used vibrant intertwined colors which were made possible through an expressive brush, and optimal ideas that express a moment, emotion, or experience, all painted in a way that allows the viewer to connect with them on a personal level.

Moreover, through its paintings that embodied values, customs and traditions, heritage the art exhibition reinforced the university's commitment to community engagement and cultural exchange. “MEU” Students Discuss Press in the Presence of the U.S Ambassador on World Press Freedom Day



Amman – Students from the Faculty of Media at the Middle East University expressed the importance of journalism in promoting democracy, supporting human rights, and promoting social justice through their participation in an event held by the U.S. Embassy and the European Union Mission in Jordan.

The event celebrates World Press Freedom Day, raises awareness about the importance of freedom of opinion and expression, and emphasize the importance of press freedom as an essential element of democratic governance. The event was attended by the Counselor of Public Affairs at the U.S Embassy Stefanie Altman-Winans, as well as the Deputy Head of the Jordanian European Union Delegation Angela Martini, and stresses the importance of citizens’ level of awareness and engagement in political decision-making.

The event provided students Abboud Al-Ghanim, Rakan Al-Kharfan, Amalia Moussa, Ruba Al-Sarahneh, Dina Abu Diyyeh, and Haneen Al-Hayek with the opportunity to discuss the challenges facing media today. This comes during a time where freedom of expression is increasingly undermined, despite the sacrifices made by media workers to risk their lives in order to provide facts and bring awareness to the public.

In this regard, Dr. Hala Amr, a Faculty Member at the Faculty of Media at the university explained that free press is the cornerstone of democratic societies. She continued saying that free press serves as an authority that exposes corruption and injustice, and promotes transparency and accountability.

She added that journalists work tirelessly to provide society with the news and information it needs to make calculated decisions, which allow for meaningful dialogues on the most important issues .

For their part, students Al-Ghanim and Al-Kharfan stated that it is necessary to fight for and defend press every day, as threats of all kinds and levels are a direct threat to fundamental freedoms and democracy.

Students Al-Mousa and Al-Sarahna agreed that defending press freedom and protecting the rights of journalists and media workers are collective responsibilities, and that the principles of press freedom must be maintained and upheld. This includes the right to access information and the protection of sources.

Students Abu Dayyeh and Hayek pointed out the role of the media, which in today's world is more important than ever, especially with the spread of disinformation at an unprecedented rate. This calls for a free and independent press to counter false narratives and promote fact-based reporting.

Dr. Nasereddin Awards Faculty of Law for Obtaining German FIBBA Accreditation



Amman – Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the Middle East University Dr. Yacoub Nasereddin stressed during his patronage of the ceremony honoring the Faculty of Law for obtaining the German accreditation (FIBAA), that this accreditation is a clear proof of the university's seriousness and continuous commitment to improving the quality of education by linking it to global requirements. He continued by saying that the university provides a guarantee to students, employers, and the community that its programs meets international standards, and prepares graduates to succeed in the global labor market.

He added in presence of the University President Prof. Salam Al-Mahadin, the Dean of Law Prof. Ahmed Al-Lozi, as well as faculty members and administrative staff at the university that the university's good reputation, academic sobriety, and community presence, imposed its respect in the academic, scientific, research, and community connections. She also praised everyone's efforts and contributions in the university's success in the field of international accreditations, which highlights its importance in that it is a compass that guides student towards the committed university.

In turn, Prof. Al-Mahadin said in the ceremony, which was organized by the Faculty Member at the Faculty of Law Dr. Ayman Al-Rafou, that occasions such as this one have a special meaning. She continued by saying that this short celebration is the culmination of year-round efforts to obtain this well-deserved accreditation that will change the quality of education, as accreditations are not just certificates to hang on a wall, but an opportunity to reflect on progress and development.

She expressed her happiness of the efforts made by everyone, at a time when the decisions made were in response to the directives of His Excellency Dr. Nasereddin, who never once hesitated to lead our ship in the face of all obstacles.

For his part, the Dean of Law Dr. Al-Lozi explained that this achievement did not come by chance, but rather in response to the initiatives of Dr. Nasereddin at a time when we were asking ourselves questions about the next step immediately after obtaining the local quality assurance certificate in its golden version. The result of that was the Faculty of Law obtaining the German FIBAA accreditation, which will make us in the ranks of international universities, as it is important to consider accreditations as the differentiating factor in proving the standards used in building up the educational process.

41 academics and administrators who participated in the process of obtaining the German FIBAA accreditation were awarded during the celebration.

Discussions of Hosted International Programs Projects at “MEU”



Amman – Students of the international programs at the Middle East University have finished discussing their graduation projects in the Computer Security and Forensics Program at the University of Bedfordshire, hosted at the university.

The second cohort of the above-mentioned program's discussions was held online, and led by Bedfordshire faculty members Dr. Khalid Al Hussain and Dr. Sharish Khan.

The students' projects varied between: "Using Artificial Intelligence Algorithms in Information Security", "Social Security Awareness", "Data Encryption Algorithms", and "Information Security on Cloud Computing".

The discussion committee expressed its satisfaction with the level of the submitted research and projects, the students' scientific and presentation skills, and the technical readiness of the university to complete the online discussions with professionalism and high quality.

“MEU” Signs Memorandum of Understanding with Istiklal Hospital for the training of Physiotherapy Students



Amman – The Middle East University has signed a memorandum of understanding with Istiklal Hospital, which states that physiotherapy student are to be trained at the hospital upon completing at least 100 study hours.

The memorandum comes to complete the university's plans to prepare students to become competent practitioners who provide their patients with high-quality care by combining classroom instruction with practical clinical experience.

On behalf of the university, the memorandum was signed by the Dean of Allied Medical Sciences Dr. Anas Al-Ashram, and on behalf of the hospital, its Executive Director Dr. Muayad Omar. The memorandum was signed in the presence of the field training assistant Dr. Qusai Al-Janada, as well as faculty member Dr. Hanan Al-Shamali.

The memorandum aims to develop students' skills in clinical thinking, problem solving, and learning how to adapt their treatment plans to meet each patient's unique needs. This includes assessment, treatment planning, and implementation.

The memorandum provides physiotherapy students with the opportunity to specialize in a specific area of practice, such as neurology, pediatrics, sports, or orthopedics, thus making them experts in their field.

“MEU” Engineering Students Visit Edrak Foundation for Special Education

It is worth noting that the Middle East University has been able to obtain advanced ranks in the field of accreditations, the latest of which are the Faculty of Law obtaining the German FIBAA accreditation, in addition to the Faculty of Business obtaining the membership of the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB).

“MEU” Students are Introduced to the Basis of TV Coverage During Dialogue Session



Amman – The Faculty of Media at the Middle East University has been hosting journalist and media figures as part of its intensive dialogue sessions that put students in front of interlocutors from the front lines of journalism.

Fuad El Karsheh to Begin Lecturing at “MEU Media” Next Semester



Amman –Journalist and presenter at Roya News Channel Fuad El Karsheh will start lecturing the courses "Voice Coaching for Radio and Television" and "Radio and Television Interview Skills" throughout the next summer semester.

In this regard, the Dean of Media Dr. Hanan Al-Sheikh said that practitioners bring an abundance of practical knowledge and experience that can greatly enrich the learning experience of students. She continued by saying that their experiences in the fields they specialize in provide valuable insights which help bridge the gap between theory and practice.

She added that the inclusion of such experts provides a sense of credibility and originality within the classroom, where students can learn from individuals who have achieved success and recognition in their fields. In addition, it inspires confidence and motivation, and encourages students to push themselves and set ambitious goals.

It is worth mentioning that the journalist Fouad El Karsheh is a graduate of the Faculty of Media at the Middle East University at its master's level, and he presents the program Helwa Ya Donia on the Roya TV channel.

“MEU” Research Recognizes the Importance of Providing Training Programs for Journalists Within their Institutions



Amman – During their participation in the first scientific conference held at the university in September 2022, two faculty members at the Faculty of Media at the Middle East University presented a research titled: "Media between university education outputs and labor market requirements".

The participation of Dr. Kamel Khushid and Dr. Saddam Almashaqbeh comes as an implementation of the university's values that recognize outstanding achievements, in line with what it takes to realize the definition of a respected university.

The research aimed to identify the effectiveness of media training programs for communicators in Jordanian governmental and private media institutions. The percentage of institutions that contain specialized sectors for training reached 43.9%, while the percentage of institutions interested in holding training courses reached 51.5%.

According to the research, 53.0% of journalists describe the percentage of digital technologies they learn from training courses as significant, while the percentage of those who believe that the level of use of artificial intelligence applications in training is average reached 50%.

Among the presented recommendations, the researchers saw the importance of developing training programs for journalists within their institutions, as providing journalists with the necessary skills and knowledge is critical to support the principles of responsible journalism, which ensures the dissemination of accurate and reliable information to the public. These training programs can also cover topics like journalism ethics, investigative reporting techniques, information verification methodologies, digital literacy, media ethics, data journalism, and multimedia storytelling.

University's Art exhibition with unique techniques receives the attention of the Minister of Culture



Amman– The exhibition of plastic artist and faculty member at the Faculty of Architecture and Design at the Middle East University Dr. Ansaf Al-Rabady, received the attention of Minister of Culture Haifa Al-Najjar, following the exhibition's opening at the Royal Cultural Center.

The exhibition, titled "Al-Aqsa Islamic Aesthetics", was organized in cooperation with Alrowad Association for Plastic Arts, and included 65 paintings that used oil colors on canvas.

In this regard, the Dean of Architecture and Design Dr. Ayman Awwad said that the exhibition is a reflection of the human experience, as its paintings allow the viewer to explore and reflect on different aspects of the human experience.

Dr. Rabady explained that these paintings are inspired by nature, legacies, social culture, and memory of places. She added that these paintings explore the essential aspects of the human experience, strengthen connections with nature and diverse cultures, preserve memories, and spark thought and dialogue on important societal issues.

For his part, the Association's President, plastic artist Khalil Al-Kofahi explained that this exhibition coincides with the 75th anniversary of the 1948 Nakba. He said that the exhibition represents a major leap in pictorial storytelling using the technique of overlapping lines that add realism to works that embody Al-Aqsa and the holy sites in Palestine.

The University Puts its Students in a Legal Dialogue with a National Security Expert



Amman – Students of the "Nationality Law" course at the Faculty of Law interviewed the representative of the National Center for Security and Crisis Management and strategic specialist in national security issues, Counselor Raed Ahmed Al-Lawzi about the issue of loss of nationality in Jordanian law, and the role of social media platforms in creating opportunities for immoral and harmful recruitment.

The university places its students in dialogue sessions with specialists from the field so that they can share recent case law, legislative changes, and emerging issues. This gives students a thorough and accurate understanding of the legal scene.

In this regard, Al-Lawzi, in the presence of the course lecturer Dr. Tamara Nasereddin, stressed the importance of censoring social media platforms to reduce deception that may end in recruitment by hostile parties. He also stressed that it is important to think carefully about the consequences and potential challenges, at a time when extremist ideologies must be addressed firmly.

Al-Lawzi discussed the reasons that put a person at risk of losing his Jordanian nationality. These reasons include engaging in military service with an enemy state, or performing an act that poses a danger or threatens the country's security and safety.

Theatrical Work by the National Center for Culture and Arts, and a lecture on Social Hierarchy at “MEU”



Amman – The Community Peace Center of the Preventive Security Directorate, in cooperation with the National Center for Culture and Arts, delivered an awareness lecture on the campus of the Middle East University on confronting extremist ideology and the optimal use of social media sites and electronic games.

The lecture was followed by a theatrical work carried out by the theater team at the center in cooperation with the university. The theatrical work was about the dangers of social media sites and facing electronic recruitment.

The awareness and theatrical event was attended by the Dean of Student Affairs Dr. Ayman Al-Khazaleh, the deans of faculties at the university, a number of local community leaders and employees of the directorate, and a group of students.

Lieutenant Alaa Al-Hammad talked in his speech about how social media sites and electronic games have a significant impact on social hierarchy. He added that they also change the dynamics of social interactions, and reshape the way individuals perceive and consolidate their social status.

For his part, Al-Khazaaleh said that the excessive use of social media sites and electronic games leads to a reduction in face-to-face social interactions, and may affect the development of basic social skills.

He also said that the current social hierarchy may be affected by social media sites, posing a risk to social welfare. He added that the quest for a more balanced digital landscape requires collective effort, aware participation, and a commitment to creating opportunities for a social movement that addresses the underlying inequalities that persist offline.

The Ministry of Labor Sponsors a Career Day at the University Including Over 60 Companies



Amman– The Ministry of Labor sponsored a career day that brought together more than 60 companies at the Middle East University, providing a space to help students make informed decisions about their academic endeavors, and ensuring that their interests align with their career prospects.

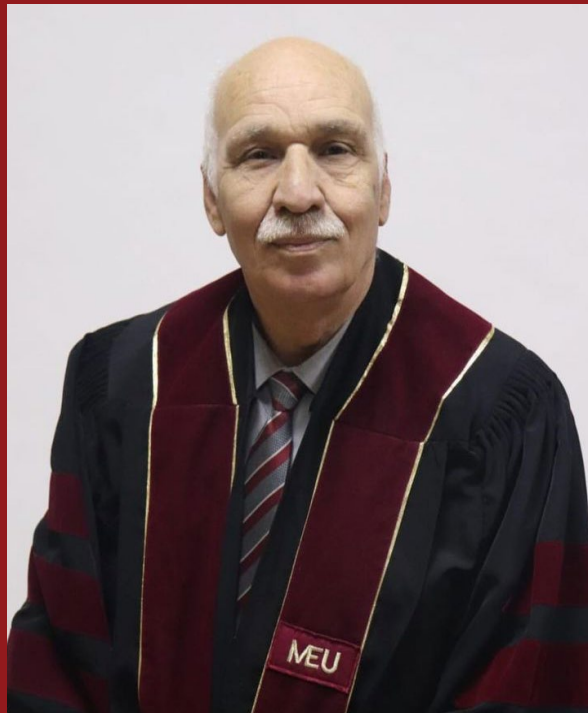
This exhibition is part of the students’ memory that will help them shape their understanding of events around them.

He stressed that the conference research papers upheld the concepts of digital governance, which is meant to be a proactive step that leads a digital government's processes, which are based upon the use of information and communication technology

in public administrations. This will aid in governing these administrations in a way that links the reciprocal relationship between the government and citizens with that of interest groups. It will also help provide services and complete transactions easily, effectively and transparently.

For his part, Dr. Salameh explained that the digital transformation that the world is undergoing increases the intensity of competition between universities and the education market significantly in terms of attracting students and professors, as well as providing digital infrastructure and integration between face-to-face and distance learning.

He pointed out that this competition has become an essential part of the global shift towards knowledgeable societies and the digital economies, the global market for which is estimated to be worth about 100 trillion Dollars, with a contribution to the general domestic product (GDP) at the global level that reaches about 25%, while its contribution to the Arab GDP is about 4%. Prof. Al-Mahadin highlighted that from its establishment, the Middle East University has embraced the principles of governance and made them integral to its work ethic. The university has consistently upheld and implemented these principles, which played a pivotal role in its attainment of quality and excellence. Furthermore, the transformation of governance systems worldwide has sparked a reformation of

The recommendations focused on increasing investment in technological advantage by working to activate the role of information networks and improve the possibility of benefiting from them, adopting the application of human resources

governance in accordance with the international standard (ISO-30408) in its various dimensions, using tools to ensure that the level of interest in them does not decline or decrease, and developing organizational capabilities in big data applications and cloud computing.

The recommendations stressed the need for successful planning to design an attractive e-learning environment that motivates students, providing the necessary technical support to educational institutions and their managers to enable them to apply the standards of the International Society for Technology, encouraging the applications of digital transformation in activities and operations, expanding the uses of artificial intelligence in developing logical thinking skills and motivation to learn, encouraging the adoption of strategic vigilance as a forward-looking development approach, encouraging strategic leadership practices and spiritual leadership in organizations, and holding joint scientific conferences and forums. Between local, Arab and international universities to activate the role of governance in upgrading universities.

The workshop focused on the importance of erudition, as the presenter staying up-to-date with current events is crucial, along with analytical skills that will enable him to critically evaluate news stories and provide comprehensive perspectives.

In turn, Dr. Hala Amr, a faculty member at the faculty and the lecturer of the “Voice Coaching for Radio and Television” course stressed the importance of this type of workshop, as it puts students in front of experienced broadcasters who exchange practical knowledge and techniques for radio work with students after years of experience. This qualifies students for the requirements of the profession, and prepares them for the upcoming challenges in the industry.

At the end of the workshop, booklets containing the most important words misused words in visual and audio media were handed out to the students.

It should be noted that Al-Agha worked as a news presenter in the Libyan radio since 1970, and a presenter of various programs until 1998, then returned to Jordan to work in the same year in the field of voiceover and dubbing on documentaries, cartoons, and foreign series.
