It is worth noting that the center always aims to immerse students in relevant and direct impact experiences, especially since the university believes in experimental science based on putting students in front of real-world scenarios. This appears in the field of media in the form of interviews and dialogue sessions that ensure access to journalistic teachings.

The work tells a story about the things that may stand in the youth's way of after their graduation, and emphasizes that the achievement of goals should not be linked solely to university degree. This comes at a time when it is necessary to rely on innovative skills and break out of the usual in order to achieve success.

Prof. Anis Al-Mansour, Director of the Consulting and Training Center, explained that through its partnership with the Crown Prince Foundation, the university derives a perspective that helps educate local communities and Jordanian youth about reality along with its issues, problems, and concerns. Prof. Mansour added that theatrical works and performances have great impacts, as they often delve into complex social and cultural issues, allowing the actors to adopt diverse personalities that offer in-depth perspectives.

He stressed that the importance of such works, which come in cooperation with the Deanship of Student Affairs, comes from teaching students to express their thoughts clearly, amplify their voices, and use body language to express feelings, which is of great importance in building their characters to prepare for personal and professional settings after graduation.
