Middle East University **Obtains ABET Accreditation for Civil Engineering, Renewable Energy, and Computer Science Programs**

Amman - The Civil Engineering and Renewable Energy Engineering programs in the Faculty of Engineering, as well as the Computer Science program in the Faculty of Information Technology, have received the American ABET Accreditation. This increases the number of specializations accredited internationally at the university in different faculties like Pharmacy, Arts and Educational Sciences, Law, and Business.

The new accreditation comes as an achievement of one of the most important goals of the university's strategic plan, which aims to obtain international accreditation and global recognition for all its faculties' programs.

The American Board for Engineering and Technology (ABET) aims to monitor and evaluate engineering and technological education programs in many countries around the world, ensuring their quality through eight standards: students, educational program objectives, student outcomes, continuous improvement, curriculum, faculty and staff competence, educational facilities, and institutional support.

The ABET accreditation is considered to be a strong indicator of the quality of educational programs in the fields of engineering and technology. It enhances their reputation, elevates the level of higher education in these fields, and enables students and graduates to gain a competitive advantage that contributes to increased employment opportunities and success in their professional lives.

MEU's President During a Meeting with Faculty Members: "We will continue to implement the strategy of advancing the educational process"

Amman - The Middle East University President, Prof. Salam Al-Mahadin, met with the deans of faculties and faculty members to talk about the next stage of hard work, as an integral part of the strategic plan that seeks to improve the educational process, measure the effectiveness of study programs, and get out of the usual educational mold that no longer meets the requirements of the new labor market.

The meeting was attended by the Vice President of the Board of Directors, a faculty member at the Faculty of Business, Dr. Ahmad Nasereddin, the deans of the faculties, the Assistants to the President, Prof. Tamara Nasereddin and Dr. Saleem Sharif, as well as faculty members.

At the beginning of the meeting, Al-Fatiha was read on the souls of the victims who passed away in the earthquake in Morocco, and the floods in Libya.

Prof. Al-Mahadin said that the university has given its graduates, through its courses and applied programs, preference in the labor market, as training courses and programs have played an important role in giving graduates a competitive advantage in the labor market. She went on to say that the university's graduates are directly related to the career paths they have chosen, which makes them more valuable for employers looking for candidates who can contribute and unleash their ideas from day one, adding that practical training at the university is not exclusive to the academic year before graduation, but is divided over the course of all of the study years.

She added during a speech at the meeting, which was moderated by a faculty member at the Faculty of Arts and Educational Sciences, Dr. Jumana Al-Salem, that all faculties of the university have found a place for themselves in the field of international and local accreditations, indicating that the course plans of the university's study programs are in line with the National Qualifications Framework. This calls for the need to measure the effectiveness of study programs by preparing files related to the indicators of the educational process by measuring the degree of their effectiveness.

Prof. Al-Mahadin stressed that the university is continuously working to define the concept of community service, which is concerned with cooperating with local community institutions, in addition to crystallizing the concept of scientific research, which will appear through a large group of research published in the Scopus database throughout 2023.

At the end of the meeting, an extensive dialogue took place between the University President and faculty members, which focused on scientific research, international accreditations, measuring the effectiveness of study programs, and the mechanism of curriculum development.



MEU Media Holds Its First General Assembly Meeting



Amman – The Faculty of Media at the Middle East University held the first general assembly meeting to develop a guiding path that examines the quality of study programs and the suitability of their courses to the latest developments in the field of <u>journalism</u>.

The meeting, which was attended by the Dean of the Faculty, Dr. Hanan Al-Sheikh, and faculty members, focused on the importance of faculty members being closely and actively informed of changes in media consumption habits and emerging technologies. It also focused on the need to integrate technology into curricula, and prepare students for looming technologies such as virtual reality, augmented reality, and artificial intelligence in journalism.

The meeting discussed the essence of the faculty's scientific curriculum to assess whether the faculty keeps pace with emerging journalism and media trends. Such trends include digital journalism, multimedia storytelling, and data-driven reporting, which are guaranteed to enhance graduates' capabilities and equip them with everything they need to conquer the modern media landscape.

In this regard, the Dean of the Faculty, Dr. Al-Sheikh, said that this meeting's importance comes from the Middle East University's deeply rooted values aimed at providing a space to nurture minds. She added that this meeting exceeds the limits of exchanging ideas, and that it is compass that guides faculty members towards innovative education.

She pointed out that the world of journalism and media is undergoing rapid transformations, driven by technological progress, and a change in consumer behavior, and that this meeting provides a platform to measure these transformations and ensure that the faculty's program plans remain at the forefront of this vital field.



MEU Launches Diploma in Meteorology and Its Modern Applications



Amman - The Middle East University launched the Diploma in Meteorology and its Modern Applications, in cooperation with the Arabia Weather Academy. The program will go on until June of 2024, at a rate of 300 training hours divided over the span of 9 months.

On behalf of the university, the launch ceremony was attended by the Director of the Consulting and Training Center, Prof. Anis Al-Mansour, and on behalf of the academy, the Weather Forecast Advisor at Arabia Weather, Dr. Jamal Al-Muosa.

The training diploma aims to provide individuals with the knowledge, skills, and expertise necessary to make significant and distinguished contributions to meteorological sciences and climate security, thus contributing to protecting the planet and ensuring a sustainable future based on proactive measures to mitigate and adapt to climate-related threats.

The program seeks to train experts who can understand the complexities of weather and climate, at a time when climate security is a vital and important aspect of modern human life. The program also aims to address global concerns surrounding climate change including its impacts on ecosystems, human societies, and international security.

The program is based on the primary principles of meteorology, including the study of weather elements, weather forecasts, meteorology, building weather maps and their use in making weather forecasts, identifying different numerical models, types of weather maps, and meteorological applications in aviation, maritime transport, and land transport.

MEU and Public Security Directorate Organize Awareness Workshop about **New Traffic Laws**





Amman - The Middle East University organized an awareness workshop on the new traffic law in cooperation with the Mass Media and Community Policing Directorate at the Public Security Directorate. Present at the workshop were the University President, Prof. Salam Al-Mahadin, the Director of External Patrols, Brigadier General Yasser Al-Habahba, the Director of the Central Badia Police, Colonel Hani Al-Oweidat, Major Malik Al-Qadi, Captain Hatem Al-Shawabkeh, deans of faculties, as well as faculty and administrative staff members.

In this regard, Brigadier General Al-Habahba said in the presence of a number of security officials that there are many factors that called for urgent and necessary stiffening of penalties. This includes factors that did not previously exist, a few of which being that the number of traffic accidents in the year 2022 reached 169,000 accidents, 12,000 of which resulted in human injuries, whereas the number of deaths reached 600 deaths, with a total cost of 322 million Jordanian dinars for the year 2022, and 1.6 billion Jordanian dinars during the last 5 years.

He explained that the amendments to the traffic law come to promote disciplined behavior, prevent reckless driving, hold individuals accountable for their actions, educate the public, provide consistency and predictability, and address various threats to road safety.

Brigadier General Al-Habahba indicated that the new traffic law will contribute to reducing accidents and saving lives on the roads, as traffic laws and strict penalties play a pivotal role in reducing violations of laws. He added, saying that the traffic



laws address critical aspects of road safety such as speed limits, traffic signs, the right of priority of passage, traffic signals, driving under the influence of alcohol, using a mobile phone, and not wearing a seat belt.

Hestressedthatseverepenaltiesserveasadeterrent to reckless and dangerous driving behaviors, as the fear of facing serious consequences such as fines, suspension of licenses, or even imprisonment, forces individuals to think repeatedly before violating traffic laws, noting that the last is not fixed, as it evolves with technological advancement and changes in societal needs, as authorities regularly review and update these laws to address emerging issues and integrate safety innovations.

For his part, the Dean of Student Affairs at the university, in the presence of the deans of the faculties, as well as faculty and administrative staff members, said that the relationship between the university and the Public Security Directorate is exceptional and ongoing. He explained that the nightmare of traffic accidents has become a common denominator among Jordanian families, and that it is necessary to stay away from seasonal application as is common for many citizens, adding that it is time to be serious about stopping bloodshed, wasting lives, creating helplessness, and instilling fear.

The training workshop included a moving theatrical work about the stories of people who lost their lives as a result of reckless driving and non-compliance with traffic rules, in addition to a dialogue session that included an extensive discussion on the possibility of finding solutions to the so-called traffic tragedy.

Amman – The Renewable Energy Engineering Program at the Faculty of Engineering at the Middle East University has received the American ABET accreditation, the first and only public and private university programs in the Kingdom to receive this accreditation.

In addition to the above-mentioned program, the Civil Engineering program in the Faculty of Engineering, as well as the Computer Science program in the Faculty of Information Technology also received the American ABET accreditation, adding these programs to the range of specializations that have obtained international accreditations in the faculties of Pharmacy, Arts and Educational Sciences, Law, and Business.

By gaining the ABET accreditation, the program has joined four regional and global universities: Alfred University in the USA, Oregon Institute of Technology in the USA, University of Sharjah in the United Arab Emirates, and the Mediterranean Institute of Technology in Tunisia.

MEU Ranks Second in Competition For The Reconstruction Of Destroyed Palestinian Villages Held in London



Amman-The Middle East University won the second place prize in the Competition For The Reconstruction Of Palestinian Villages held in London, surpassing 13 universities, 4 of which are Jordanian and 9 are Arab.

The university's victory comes after it qualified for the shortlist, which included universities such as Al-Quds University and Al-Najah University in Palestine, in the competition organized by the Palestinian Land Society in London headed by Dr. Salman Abu Sitta.

Representing the university at the competition, which was attended by about 270 participants, was student Dina Al-Nazer from the Faculty of Architecture and Design. Al-Nazer's project revived the Palestinian village of Al-Dawayma in the Hebron District, after the displacement and genocide that the village witnessed during the Nakba war in 1948.

In this regard, the project supervisor and Head of the Architecture Department at the faculty, Dr. Shaden Abusafieh, said that the central idea of this project is about bringing the village back to life by creating architectural spaces that not only embody the essence of the lifestyle at the village, but also serve as a moving reminder of the historical struggles faced by the Palestinian people.

For her part, Al-Nazer explained that the project includes the village market, a vibrant center which is designed to give visitors a look into the daily life of the village and its traditions, along with the handicrafts and local customs that this bustling market will showcase, providing a sensory journey that will take them straight to the heart of the village.

She pointed out that the project also includes a museum that serves as an official testimony to the steadfastness and suffering of the Palestinian people, and accurately documents the countless massacres and hardships they were subjected to at the hands of the occupier throughout history. The project also includes the Phoenix Mosque, which is a symbol of hope and remembrance, and represents the indomitable spirit of the martyrs who sacrificed their lives for the Palestinian cause.

The evaluation of the competition projects was supervised by a jury consisting of: Its Chairman, Cofounder of the Palestine Renewal Team, Dr. Naser Jolzari, former President of the Royal Institute of British Architects Angela Brady, Royal Institute of Architects Award Winner Dr. Yara Sharif, and lecturer at the University of Westminster, Rim Kalsoum.
