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Employers Describe MEU's Allied Medical Sciences Students as "competent and dedicated physical therapists" During Faculty Meeting



Amman – A dialogue meeting of the Faculty of Allied Medical Sciences at the Middle East University with employers and specialists stressed the importance of preparing graduates for the work field. The meeting discussed the field's need for physicals therapists who are knowledgeable and committed to the highest level of the profession's ethics, in order to provide the best possible care for patients.

The meeting was attended by the Dean of the Faculty, Dr. Anas Al-Ashram, the Head of the Physical Therapy Department, Dr. Tariq Ibrahim, and a faculty member, Mr. Qusai Al-Janada. The guest delegation of specialist included Mr. Islam Qaddah from PhysioOne Advanced Therapy Center, Mrs. Enas Al-Tarifi from Dorrat Al-Agsa Physical Therapy Center, Mr. Muhammad Abu Al-Rus from Tla'a Al-Ali Physiotherapy Center, and Mr. Muhammad Al-Dajah from WM Physiotherapy Clinic.

The meeting discussed the extent to which the curricula are adapted to the needs of the profession, as well as the desirable qualities that owners of facilities and treatment centers are looking for in the graduate. These not only include clinical skills, but also extend to empathy, communication, teamwork, and adaptability skills.

The meeting focused on treatment planning practices, which rely heavily on patients, their ages, their condition and developments, and their community environment and characteristics. It also emphasized the need to improve communication skills, as they are essential in the field of health care, especially with the exceptional abilities that physical therapists require in order to convey complex medical information to patients and their families.

In this regard, the Dean of the Allied Medical Sciences, Dr. Al-Ashram, said that graduates of programs that actively deal with industry stakeholders are more attractive to employers because they have the knowledge and skills that directly correspond to the needs of the labor market. He added that this can lead to high employment rates, as well as an abundance of successful career transitions for students.

He pointed out that such periodic and regular dialogue meetings can be part of the process of evaluating and improving the educational program, where feedback from employers and specialists can help the faculty identify areas in its curricula and teaching methods that need improvement.



MEU Students Win Gold and Bronze Medals During Muay Thai Championship



Amman – Student of the Faculty of Business at the Middle East University, Moataz Billah Sarar, won the gold medal for the 81kg weight class of the Kingdom Muay Thai Championship, while student Saif Al-Din Al-Shammout of the Faculty of Pharmacy won the bronze medal for the 71kg weight class.

The university offers scholarships to outstanding athletes, and recognizes the importance of sports in building a serious and committed personality, and disciplined teamwork. 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Students of MEU's Medical Faculties Receive Training in Health Informatics Following Cooperation Agreement with "Hakeem"







Amman – The Middle East University signed a cooperation agreement with Electronic Health Solutions (EHS) "Hakeem" program to train students of medical faculties on health informatics, as it is considered the crossing point between healthcare and information technology, and a critical element in the providing modern health care.

On behalf of the university, the agreement was signed by its president, Prof. Salam Al-Mahadin, and on behalf of EHS, its CEO, Eng. Omar Ayesh. The agreement was signed in the presence of the Dean of the of Nursing, Dr. Anas Al-Ashram, as well as faculty members.

The significance of the agreement comes from the transformations taking place in the field of healthcare. This is driven by the integration of information technology and data science into the field, which means that students are in a world where healthcare and information technology are becoming increasingly intertwined.

In this regard, the University President, Prof. Al-Mahadin, said that the university is fully aware of the magnitude of the challenges facing graduates of various medical programs. She continued by saying that this agreement comes to provide students with the necessary tools that will help them benefit from data and technology in patient care. For his part, the CEO of EHS, Ayesh, in the presence of the Director of the of Education and Knowledge Department, Afnan Jibril, and the Hakim Academy Official, Eng. Hamza Al-Jaafra, said that it is very important to link all health sectors in the Kingdom with each other within an electronic network through which some of the needs of the public health sector can be identified. He stressed that the integration of health informatics in the education of students of medical faculties is not just a response to current trends, but rather a necessity to prepare the future generation of health care workers, and that the signing of this agreement comes to develop health informatics skills.

With Participation of the United Nations, MEU Provides Realistic Simulation of Human Rights Dialogue Sessions

Amman – The Middle East University has provided 150 students from schools in Amman with a realistic simulation of panel discussions organized by Brain Share, supervised by Senior UN Human Rights Advisor Christina Meinecke.

The dialogue sessions were opened by the Assistant to the University President, Dr. Salim Sharif, in the presence of the Director of the Center of International Programs, Mai Abu Hamdia, and relevant figures.

The dialogue sessions focused on the Global Compact, legal frameworks, and ethical human rights endeavors. This is especially important since the Universal Declaration of Human Rights is a testimony which states that rights are universal and inalienable, and affirms the free and equal birth of every person regardless of race, nationality, religion, or gender.

The dialogue sessions emphasized that human rights have an effective role to play in promoting social progress around the world. They also contribute to the elimination of slavery and discrimination, the promotion

of diplomatic solutions, conflict prevention, and the protection of vulnerable populations in times of crisis.

The dialogue sessions concluded that human rights are closely linked to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals, and with the Universal Declaration of Human Rights focusing on social and economic rights, they emphasize the need for inclusive development that leaves no one behind.

In this regard, the students agreed on the importance of such dialogue sessions in making them fully aware of human rights and everything that surrounds their legal frameworks, and is related to their noble humanitarian goals. They added that these sessions also provided them with the opportunity to be advocates for human rights in order to defend their principles and values. This provides students with the basis for engaging in everything that supports marginalized communities and challenges injustice.

They emphasized that by re-imagining a new generation, inextricably linked to human rights, they would be able to address the pressing matters of our time.

Middle East University Expresses its Stance: The Occupation Committed Moral Violations... We Unite for Gaza and Rally Around the Hashemite Leadership







Amman - A solidarity stance by the Middle East University condemned the intense Israeli bombing of the Gaza Strip, which resulted in the martyring of over 3,000 Palestinians to date, the majority of whom were children and women. The unified message of the stance is that conscience is the alarm which tells us that we are alive, and that fear, accompanied by prayer, comes from good morals that strike the chords of indifference and push us to chant loudly: "Your pain, O Gaza, is my pain... We are united today and every day"

The solidarity stance was sponsored by the Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the Middle East University, Senate Dr. Yacoub Nasereddin, and was attended by the University President, Prof. Salam Al-Mahadin, the Mayor of Giza, Qadr Al-Fayez, faculty and administrative staff members, as well as a group of students.

In this regard, Dr. Nasereddin said that what is happening in Gaza is a blatant violation of human rights, international law, and humanitarian conventions. He continued, saying that the Israeli occupation army is the source of these violations, which denounces the Palestinians' resistance to its offences on their own land. He stressed that what is happening now is very similar to what happened during The Battle of Dignity, just in another way.

He stressed the necessity of staying in line with the Jordanian constants, which call for the establishment of a Palestinian state on the land of 1967, with Jerusalem as its capital, and a Hashemite guardianship over the Islamic and Christian holy

sites therein. Dr. Nasereddin pointed out that the rally around His Majesty the King, the army, and the security services is due to the unique state of harmony between the leadership and Jordanian public, which calls for the importance of listening to the voice of truth and wisdom coming from the Hashemite leadership, while staying away from misleading news sources.

Dr. Nasereddin explained that the Hashemite leadership has succeeded in attracting the attention of the world through its wise leadership, and that His Majesty the King has told the entire world that we must avoid anything that calls for more violence against Palestinians, which will prevent the region from being dragged into a large-scale war. Dr. Nasereddin also called on everyone to refrain from creating rumors that aim to lower, disrupt, or limit determination, at a time when the children of Gaza are being murdered while in their mothers' wombs, and are being displaced and starved, which are all war crimes that require holding those behind them accountable.

For his part, the Dean of Student Affairs, Dr. Ayman Al-Khazaleh, said that today's solidarity stance answers the call of our religion and morals, saying that no other cause has united speeches, raised feelings, gained attention, and brought Jordanians and Arabs together as much as the Palestinian cause. He added that words are not just interconnected letters that don't change anything, and that they are able to express solidarity, show emotion, and demonstrate strength and certainty, as occupied Gaza needs our support.

MEU Maintains its Lead in QS Arab Region University Rankings



Amman – The Middle East University has maintained its lead in the QS Arab University Rankings in 2024, ranking in the 101110- category.

The results were announced in the State of Bahrain, with over 600 Arab universities competing for their spot on the ranking list.

The classification is based on 6 criteria: Employer reputation, faculty/student ratio, international research network, citations per paper, and papers per faculty.

This achievement is a testament to the collective efforts and unwavering commitment of the entire university community to providing world-class education, promoting cutting-edge research, and making a positive impact on society.

In this regard, the University President, Prof. Salam Al-Mahadin, said that this achievement reflects our commitment to promoting an inclusive educational environment that nurtures the talents and aspirations of its students.
